

Instructions for Contributors

Submissions

The *Georgetown Journal of Asian Affairs* welcomes original social science research papers written on issues relevant to politics, security, economy, culture, and society of contemporary Asia, including Pakistan and Afghanistan. “Contemporary” is understood broadly as recent, but not necessarily as current. We are pleased to consider articles with historical background sections so long as such analyses are crucial for advancing core arguments.

The *Georgetown Journal of Asian Affairs* will consider submissions of research articles (5,000-7,000 words). An abstract of 100-200 words and bibliography should also be provided.

Review Policy

This journal has adopted a double-blind reviewing policy, where both the reviewer and author shall remain anonymous throughout the process. To facilitate our review process, please remove all identifying features from the paper itself, ensuring that the authors’ identity is not revealed.

Please include the following separately:

- **Title page** (with author details): this should include the title of the manuscript, authors’ names, affiliations, and a complete address for the corresponding author, including an email address.
- **Blinded manuscript** (no author details): the main body of the paper (including the title, references, figures, and tables) should not include any identifying information, such as the authors’ names or affiliations.

Manuscript Formatting

Manuscripts should be double-spaced throughout. Manuscripts should be paginated with no other header or footer information. Please submit all manuscripts in **Microsoft Words** documents. The manuscript should be prepared in **Times New Roman font, font size 12, with double line spacing**.

Referencing Style

All citations should follow the [Chicago Manual of Style](#), 17th ed. notes and bibliography style. All citations must be formatted as footnotes. Please also include a full bibliography at the end. Bibliography entries should be arranged first alphabetically and then further sorted chronologically if necessary.
