Lector:	A lesson from the Book of Proverbs, chapter 8, verses 1–4 and 22–31:	

Does not wisdom call and understanding raise her voice? 
and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.







Prayers of the People and The Lord's Prayer
