Pros	Cons
Recognizes Inherent Societal Inequalities	Not an Egalitarian Approach as it Advocates for Censorship
Attempts to Give Voices to Historically Marginalized Individuals	Ignores the Fact That Offense is Subjective
Emphasis on Vulnerable Populations	Jeopardizes Intellectual Growth and Diversity

Egalitarianism in Speech


Pros	Cons

Conducive to Learning	Falsely Assumes That Individuals Act Rationally When Offended
Treats Opinions and Individuals Equally	Falsely Assumes That All People Are Equal In Practice


