Call for Papers: China, Christianity, & the Dialogue of Civilizations

The US-China Catholic Association is currently accepting paper and session proposals for its conference on "China, Christianity, and the Dialogue of Civilizations," to take place <u>August 6-8</u>, <u>2021</u> on the campus of **Santa Clara University**.

The theme of this conference is the engagement between Christianity and Chinese civilization. Panels may examine this theme in light of recent challenges, the larger horizon of shared values, and/or pursuit of the common good.

A note about this particular conference model: Attendees will include both scholars and people involved in various faith communities. The purpose of these panels is to share the insights of the academic community and the perspectives of its various disciplines with the larger, informed public.
