

## **Experience India**The Indian Field Seminar (IM853)

The seminar will run from early January 2015, returning by January 17<sup>th</sup> (11-13 nights total) and is open to MBA and MPH students.

The India Field Seminar is designed for MBA and MPH students who seek to understand the rapidly changing global forces of the health sector as they intersect with the dynamics of an emerging country through experiential learning in India.

Following three Saturday meetings in Boston this fall, students will travel to India for approximately 12 days in early January 2015, visiting Delhi, Mumbai, and Bangalore. The field seminar will include visits to government agencies, hospitals, pharmaceutical companies, health sector start-ups, health centers, and research laboratories. Issues of particular interest include technology and bio-pharma development, effective service delivery with limited resources, the role of entrepreneurial initiative in complex environments, and the potential to leapfrog development in underdeveloped settings.

This seminar is available as a Spring SMG elective and is open to MBA and MPH students.
