It is also open on a case-by-case basis to undergraduates with strong performance in Latin America-focused courses. Professor Juárez and other members of the Pardee School Latin American Studies Program faculty will participate in topics covered in the seminar in accordance with their specific areas of expertise, as presented in the weekly schedule.
